TWO RESIDENTS PASSED AWAY



Dasha Ji (73 years old) - She was bedridden and completely dependent on care. She came through recommendation of Indore Collector.

Sharvan Kumar (58 years old) – Originally from Khategaon (Dewas), he was a dying destitute who came to Sewadham on his own by self motivation. He was extremely weak, unable to sit or speak properly, and suffered from diabetes, liver disease, and a fractured leg. Sharvan Kumar lost his parents a few years ago. His house and land were lost due to an insurance claim because of an accident. His son tragically committed suicide in 2019, leaving him completely alone. In this darkness, he found hope and came to Sewadham.

Both were given a dignified farewell, and their last rites were performed in Ujjain, where they were transported with a municipal vehicle. Sudhir Bhai believes that those who come here have a karmic connection from past lives, which is why he always shoulders them in their final journey.

TODAY'S SUCCESS STORY -

SAFE DELIVERY OF A VICTIMIZED MENTALLY CHALLENGED WOMAN



On Ganesh Chaturthi (7 Sept 2024), during the evening aarti, a thought arose-every year, we receive divine blessings, but this year, no one new had come to the Ashram. At 8 PM, a police vehicle from Bhairavgarh Police Station arrived with a mentally challenged, sexually abused, pregnant woman who was wandering in Nagpura. Her condition was extremely fragile, and her survival, along with that of her unborn child, seemed impossible. She was aggressive at times, making care even more challenging. Despite all odds, Kanta Bhabhiji with her team cared for her with immense dedication. On April 1st, she suddenly went into labor. Bhaiji arranged for an ambulance and sent her to Ujjain, praying for a safe delivery. Before she left, he fed her sweets as a blessing. Nursing staff Jyoti and Amrita Dadi accompanied her to the hospital along with our volunteer Akash. Soon, news arrived that she had safely delivered a healthy baby girl.

She arrived at the Ashram as a helpless woman, but during Navratri, she became a symbol of motherhood and the blessing in form of the baby girl was named **Shreemaya**.
